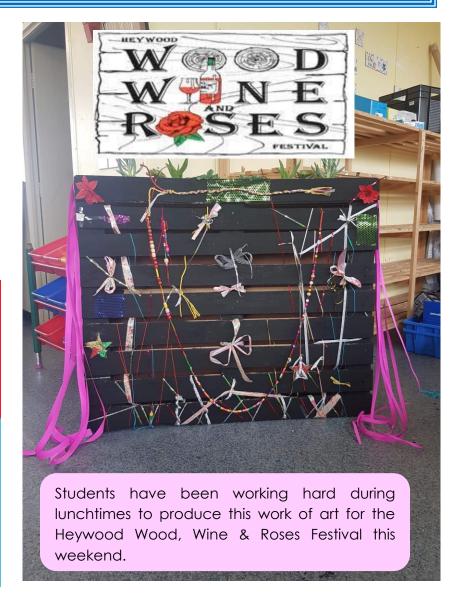

#### Rated PG

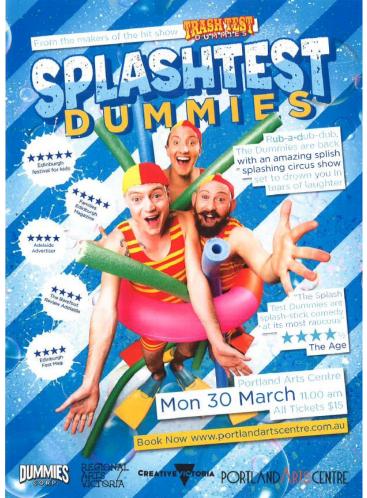
