

Notes from Mrs Hulonce...

This week has been simply fabulous. It is brilliant to have staff back on site and our Juniors getting back into their learning. We have had success with new health and hygiene requirements and students have all brought drink bottles to school. Just a reminder about the following:

Restrictions on access to the school site for anyone other than immediate school staff and students- Parents are not to congregate in carparks or linger after dropping off or collecting their children.

After school, students will wait in the collection zones.

We ask parents to remain in cars, and allow staff to direct children. We are aiming for free flowing through the zones, so we'll be asking people to "do a lap" if their child is not ready for collection.

Please follow staff direction when moving around these areas.

FYI- eventually all student access during normal drop off and pick up times will be from the Edgar Street entry. This will take effect when DET alters directives and when the area is more suitable to larger numbers of students.

Parent and carer survey-

Thanks to all who have managed to complete this survey. This is what you told us:

- Feeling awesome about home learning up from 16.7% to 22%, pretty good up from 38% to 40%. Uncertain/Negative has dropped from 17% to 15%. Mostly positive.
- Favourites: Literacy has improved from 29%. Maths slightly improved from 23%.
- Least faves: Opinions of Maths have massively increased. STEM about the same in both surveys.
- Concerns: Last survey it was mostly about learning progress and work habits. Learning progress worries have dropped from 50 to 20%. Work habit concerns dropped from 27% to 23%. This time around people have added positives. Eg. "none/ no problems". This indicates people are feeling supported.
- Parents have appreciated Bundarra staff for Seesaw, communication and extra support.

FUTURE WORK- to consider:

- How we can utilise Seesaw in normal classroom practice?
- How homework tasks can be made more engaging
- What can be done to continue to raise the profile of maths learning- It's fun!

SCHOOL COUNCIL SUMMARY 26/5/2020

Education Report- School reports will look different this year due to the time the students have spent at home. The reports will not include the normal progression points but will still have feedback about the student.

Today was the first day back to school. Overall the students did great and have settled in well. There will be no official parent teacher interviews in Term 2, however if parents wish to discuss their child, phone or webex appointments can be arranged.

Environment & Sustainability Report- Louise, Trevor, Rai and John will meet about the PBS site when we are back to usual school practices.

Bird netting work to be completed- Rai and Tara discussing when this is to happen. It has worked and birds have gone, but we need to tidy it up.

School Management Plan website being used. All condition and regular maintenance tasks are detailed and scheduled. This will use our Maintenance Blitz 2019 funds and more over the next 5 years.

Old Library removal has been approved and will proceed as soon as possible.

Camps, events and Excursions- Report Writing Day- 5th June 2020 (No Students)

The P&HDPSSA (Portland and Heywood District Primary School Sports Association) has agreed that the local sporting events we have missed will not be rescheduled for later in 2020. Upcoming events will be determined based upon DET directives. Bundarra will hold some version of the School Athletics Sports when we are able to.

There has been no update on the swimming program for 2020. Waiting for DET directions.

Parent survey 2 data discussion- There were 40 responses. Improvements were seen from the first survey to the second.

- The biggest concern to parents about their children was the child's concentration and motivation.
- Parents "needing help" has changed since previous survey. 87% wanted help with motivation- this has dropped to 40%. No-one wanted us to contact them this time around either.
- Behavioural issues have risen from last time.
- Learning progress worries have dropped from 50 to 20%.
- Work habits dropped from 27% to 23%
- This time around people have added positives- some have no worries. This indicates people are feeling supported.

Future work-

- How we can utilise Seesaw in normal classroom practice to capitalise on parent engagement?
- Find a way to harness parent involvement in their children's education
- How homework tasks can be made more engaging
- What can be done to continue to raise the profile of maths learning- they enjoy it!
