Getting Along

Compassion

- 2. Read **books** with compassion themes. There are many books for children with kindness and compassion as central themes. The more the topic is discussed, the greater the opportunities to practice in real life.
- 3. Discuss suffering. Helping children notice the suffering of others is a first step in cultivating the action needed to alleviate that suffering.

2/3 Classes - Term 3 2020 Remote Learning (Online)


The students in Grade 2/3 are expected to be reading everyday (Independent Reading) and recording themselves reading a few pages. The students will be doing Reading, Writing, Spelling and Maths activities each day. It is important that the students (with family support) read the daily schedule so they know what all the activities are for each day. For Maths the students will be revising topics that have been covered so far: place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and the introduction of some new topics: money and chance and data. In Reading the students will be doing a range of activities and stories. The students will still be doing Sounds Write Spelling and some other spelling activities also. In Writing the students will have opportunities to have free choice as well as having a variety of writing tasks to keep them practicing their writing skills and to engage them in writing. We have kept each day set out in a similar way to make it easier for students and families so there is a routine to follow.

Indie V Miss Mee and her Megalodons.



1. Colour Changing Milk


You will need milk, dishwashing liquid and food colouring
