

#### Technology

Students study Technology for a Semester in Year 7. Students learn new skills using traditional hand tools working with timber and acrylic. They also gain experience with 3D printers and use CAD software to design and print their own designs.

During this time they are introduced to The Design Process that underpins all work in technology at PSC, right through to senior school. The Design Process is an approach for breaking down a large project into manageable chunks. Architects, engineers, scientists, and other thinkers use the Design Process to solve a variety of problems.

Students identify their own storage needs and apply their knowledge of The Design Process along with their experience with different materials to develop and construct a functioning prototype for a storage organiser.

#### Maths

In Maths, you will learn a variety of skills that are relevant to their lives including numeracy, integers, linear equations, linear graphs, statistics, probability, fractions, decimals, percentages, algebra and measurement. We focus on three key skills that you will always use for Maths, no matter the topic:

understanding and fluency, problem solving and reasoning. We use a variety of different types of assessments such as projects, tests and online learning tasks.

#### Drama



The compulsory semester long Drama Course at Year 7 provides students with a stimulating opportunity to explore dramatic situations and stories in the professional space of the Drama Centre. Students make and create drama through improvisation, role- play, scripts and other stimulus materials, as they explore different cultures, times and places.

Learning the basics of performing and how to use and move around a typical performance space comes first, followed by improvisation games, including theatre sports, where teams play competitive role-playing games against each other. Further into the course the students use scripts, lights, sets, props and costumes to add to the dramatic experience. Towards the end, Greek theatre customs are researched and the mythology of ancient Greece is used to inspire different storytelling.

At Year 7, the focus is on fun, participation and communication. The ability to concentrate and persevere while rehearsing and performing is also paramount. All aspects of cooperation and team building skills are also developed. Students learn what is required to create clear and interesting scenes, while audience skills are established as being equally important.




## **PSLC Nippers Season**
