Please see the 'Country' groupings for both the Senior and Junior students, so that you can start to prepare your outfits for the day.



#### **Health and Physical Eduacation**

Physical Education aims to build on skills and fitness. Throughout the year you will participate in swimming, minor games, SEPEP soccer and sofcrosse. The lagoon run and beep test are annual highlights of our fitness program as students set personal challenges and friendly rivalries each year. Health explores resilience, rights and respectful relationships, puberty and personal wellbeing. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in a variety of inter-school sports.

#### LOTE - Indonesian

Learning a new language is a great way to explore the world around us!

At PSC, students learn Indonesian as a second language. Our Indonesian classrooms are colourful, fun and busy spaces where students learn about Indonesian language and culture. In Year 7, we learn to greet each other and talk about ourselves in Indonesian; we learn about popular sports and watch an Indonesian soccer movie; and we also explore schools in Indonesia and talk about our own school life using Indonesian. (Fun fact: In Indonesia, school starts at 7am!) We start off the year learning some new words and by the end of the year, we are able to write a whole paragraph in Indonesian about ourselves and our school life.
