#### **Census 2021**

Last Friday was Census day, and we are delighted to announce that 19 students attended onsite and online every single day this year! Congratulations to these students and their families. Student attendance is vital to future success and is a great practice to get into. If you find you are having trouble with this, please contact our office and we'll be able to help.

#### Student Opinion Survey data

Staff and School Council have reviewed our Grade 4-6, 2020 student survey data this week. It's pretty interesting, given that 2020 was such an unprecedented year. The following positives were noted:

- 95% of students say their parents believe school is important.
- 92% believe we have respect for diversity.
- 92% feel supported and have someone to talk to about concerns.
- 92% feel calm and relaxed about covid.
- 84% believe they are putting in their best effort.

Items of concern for us to address:

- 80% of students reported they use electronic media for more than 2 hours a day.
- 60% report being impacted by cyber bullying.
- 44% are learning things that interest them.

Discussion and analysis of this data guides future work. We plan to improve student engagement through Curriculum theme weeks, Kupa Ngal activities and SRC activities throughout the year. Cyberbullying concepts are covered in our curriculum and we educate our students in using technology in a healthy way. Newsletter articles are also another resource for families looking for ideas.





# School Attendance Policy

We want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day. There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and affects their educational outcomes.

#### Notifying the School of an Absence:

School attendance is mandated under the Education Training and Reform Act 2006. It is the responsibility of parents/carers to ensure their child regularly attends school. Parents are able to notify the school via

- Phone
- Skoolbag App
- Student Diary
- Email

#### Main Reasons for an Absence:

The main reasons for absence are:

Sickness

We understand that at times your child may become unwell. It is vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and setting good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

• Family Holidays

It's vital that holidays are planned during school holidays and not during the term. Any holidays during school time must be approved by the Principal in advance. Written notification must be given to the school for extended family holidays.

#### What are unexplained Absences?

The principal will approve or not approve any absence on a case-by-case basis. The teacher will record an absence as 'Parent Choice Unauthorised' if no explanation about the absence is given to the school.

**Unacceptable** reasons for allowing a child to stay home from school, include;

- Completing adult duties such as child-minding,
- Keeping an adult company.
- Visiting friends and relatives,
- •Shopping trips and birthdays.

## The school will follow the following processes if your child is away without a reason given:

- A phone call on the first day of absence
- If there is no contact, continued phone calls for 5 days
- After 5 days an official letter will be sent home
- After 10 days, the Principal will call to arrange a attendance meeting with parent/caregiver
- If attendance does not improve or contact cannot be made after this time, we will refer to the Department of Education.


