Students had been practicing in preparation for their conferences and carefully selecting their work to share- which has meant sifting through some awesome learning, from numeracy tasks through to project work (History and Geography weeks) and writing. It was great to feel the energy and passion as students shared their learning. I was fortunate to be able to attend a few, and I learnt about SoundsWrite (from Indy Fenech and Miss Mason) and read some inspired writing by Billy Pridham, Richard Walker and Hudson Sherwell. A massive thanks to you all for your support- we are so proud of our students!

Term 3 will bring many exciting projects:

- **Creative Workers in Schools Program-** we have Shea Rotamuh joining us to work within the Edgar St space on some exciting artistic creations. Shea will be in every Wednesday and we look forward to this project.
- **SFYS Applied Learning Project-** we successfully gained a \$8,000 School Focused Youth Service grant to run this program as part of our Kupa Ngal. Mr Grinstead will be working weekly with a group of students on woodwork. We can't wait to see what they create!
- **Gunditjmara Culture & language-** Continuing this work with Auntie Delsie will see us learn more about family, places, commands, and animals. This will involve new language cards (created with a \$2,000 Bank First grant), exciting!
- **NAIDOC WEEK-** Celebration in Week 1.
- **Book Fair-** Last week in July, in LST room.
- **Bike Track construction-** a \$30,000 Active Kids project which will begin this term, around oval area. (Concept plans being developed now)
- **Natural Playspace development-** Edgar St boundary, \$200,000 project thanks to Victorian Schools Building Authority. To incorporate different land areas and seasons, linking in with Shea's work.

As always, I thank you all for your involvement in Bundarra this term. Your support through the short lockdown and covid complications has been super appreciated.

We have lots to look forward to next term, but the most important thing for us right now is to relax and recharge ready for Term 3! I wish everyone a restful break.

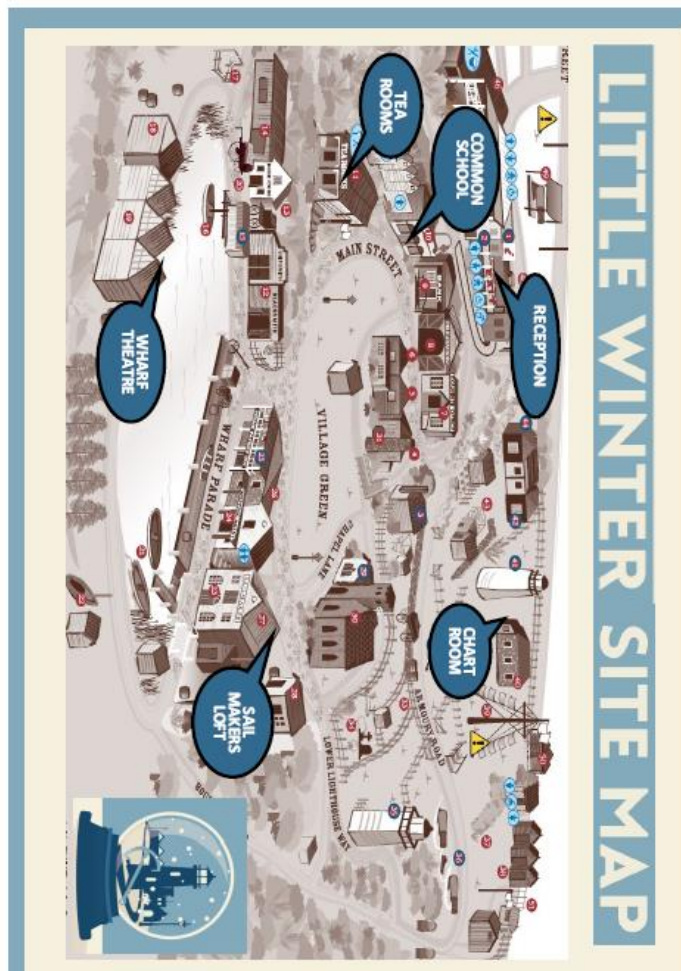
