We have had a great week here at Bundarra! Our classes have been busy with STEM and Art classes resuming to full capacity. (In line with Det Covidsafe guidelines). Indigenous bookmarks made in STEM this week are awesome. The seniors are also about to embark on an art project using technology- digital selfies! So much fun!

Another fun happening this week, was egg experiments in 34\$. The project brief involved creating something using set materials to protect an egg from breakage during a fall. I can report there was only one egg casualty.

This week Auntie Delsie popped into our senior classes and shared her story. Our students excelled with fantastic, thoughtful and respectful questions and were able to gain a better perspective of Gunditjmara life. Thank you Auntie Delsie for sharing with us.

Teachers have met to discuss student academics and wellbeing, looking at a range of data sets. Our Fountas and Pinnell data (collected every 6 months) shows where students are performing at, above and below expected Victorian Curriculum level. This data informs subsequent teaching and learning by means of student groupings, lesson content, use of resources and teaching strategies.

The Learning Support Team have also met to discuss progress, student groupings and next steps. We have experienced some great successes within MiniLit and MaqLit programs as our Learning Support students show pleasing improvement. Well done kids! It will be inspiring when we complete the data for the department next week, thanks to Mrs Holden, Miss Silva and Mrs Donald. I'm looking forward to seeing the adjusted student goals as feedback on the Tutor Learning Initiative (part of the government's learning catch up scheme).

We have had a shade sail issue- and the shade sail is partially down, this will be rectified when the technician can order a new pole. Students have been really aware and are playing safely around this area. It certainly does get windy down here!

Thanks to all our students for trying hard to stay out of puddles, we have a few developing around the school this week. If a student does get wet or muddy, we'll do our best to get them into clean clothes, and the dirty ones will come home in a plastic bag. If you need extra uniform, please contact the office and we'll see what we have. We can also apply to State Schools Relief for additional uniform supplies.

Grade 5/6 Visual Arts Unit: *Mind The Selfie*

Dear Parents and Carers,

As a part of our Visual Arts program this term students in Grade 5 and 6 are completing a unit called *Mind The Selfie* which teaches students about the artistic conventions of contemporary photography and in particular self-portraits.

During weeks 5, 6 and 7 (commencing next Tuesday 10th August) **students are allowed to bring a device with a camera from home** to capture images for use in their Visual Arts lessons.

Suitable devices include digital cameras, mobile phones or tablets. They will be collected by the classroom teacher before school and stored until the Art lesson for the day. Devices will be returned to the classroom teacher at the end of the Art lesson and will be returned to students to bring them home at the end of the day.

The only time students are allowed to have a personal device during school hours is for educational purposes.

Images will be uploaded to our school folders for the students to use in future lessons.

We have spare tablets available at school for any students who choose not to bring a device of their own.

Students will be expected to follow our Acceptable Use Policy for technology and will be fully supervised during the lesson.

Devices are brought at own risk and will only be used by the student that owns the device. No sharing will be allowed. I understand these items are expensive to repair and replace.
