Staff have been extra busy this week, and here some of what has been happening:

#### **AIP- Annual Implementation Plan REVIEW TEACHING AND LEARNING GOAL-**

Teaching Sprints processes have been examined as part of Lindy Sharp's (SEIL) feedback on our mid cycle AIP review. This collaborative work will help us review practice, stop doing what is not necessary and tweak things.

**Teaching Sprints** have provided focus for our improvement efforts. We enjoy working within teams, but have found the T3 Sprint to be a challenge with remote learning and time to focus. We enjoyed T2's Sprint more as it was whole school- on behaviour, whereas this term we have worked on different topics to suit individual teams. The specialist team is finding it difficult, as they all work part time and have limited time together.

When **NAPLAN data** comes back we will be able to examine our progress against the goals.

We are working with the VSBA on design and plans for new play area on Edgar Street- linking this to our Gunditjmara Culture and Languages project.

#### **ACTIVE KIDS GOAL-**

It is a bit too wet for us to start the bike track development, but when the weather eases this will be a priority as we can't wait to allow other opportunities for our kids to be active.

Sporting Schools program is going well, with soccer this term. We have a full house with all available places filled. We thank Mr Potter for this valuable program.

**KUPA NGAL** woodworking starts this week with Mr Grinstead and myself. This should be loads of fun and we thank SFYS for their generous donation.

Waiting for Student survey data to come back- it shouldn't be too long. When this does, it will be analysed by staff, students and School Council.

Have completed a staff activity again in response to Lindy Sharp's feedback We evidenced lots of activities we do to increase student voice both within on site and remote learning.

#### **CONNECTED KIDS GOAL-**

Have a draft "Student Voice and Agency Policy" with staff. Hopefully this will be ready for SC viewing at the next meeting.

Waiting for Staff Opinion survey to be completed and returned. When this does, it will be presented and analysed by staff and School Council as part of standard processes.

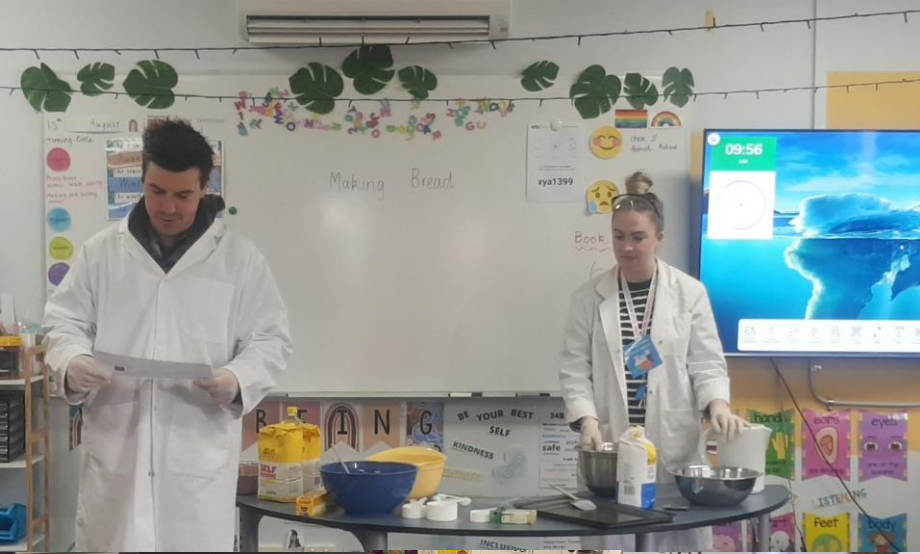
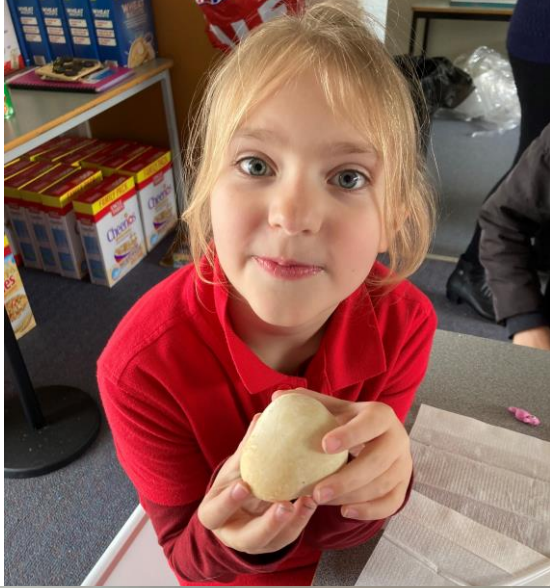
